All bids were in order, and the calculated Total Base Bids were substantially as read when opened. Eleven bids were received. The corrected Total Base Bids were as follows: Gluth Bros \$ 93, 465, 00 J & R. Ciccone 94, 320.00 George D. Hardin 97, 313, 50 Sam Cerniglia Company 100,308.50 H. P. Reger & Company 102, 417, 50 Geo. W. Kennedy Construction Co. 104, 100, 00 S. H. Cassidy Construction Co. 105,640.50 Lake Forest S & W. Construction Co. 110, 290.00 John Giannini & Sons 114, 457.00 Scully Hunter & Scully, Inc. 123, 412, 55 Till Construction Company, Inc. 145,930.00 We have checked the references of Gluth Brothers furnished to us, and have examined their record of accomplishments. We have reached the opinion that they are the lowest responsible bidder. The estimate of cost of this work, as transmitted to you on October 30, 1963, was \$122, 236. The low bid of \$93, 465 was \$28, 771, or 23.5% below the estimate. We have a letter from the Village Clerk dated December 17, 1963 informing us that the Village Board had directed a 6-inch main in Glendale from Harriet to Warwick. ## Gentlemen:

In compliance with your authorization, we have prepared and are enclosing the following papers pertaining to the Village's Motor Fuel Tax Maintenance Program for the period from January 1, 1964, to December 31, 1964, covering seal coat work:

- 1. Three (3) copies of a Supplemental Maintenance Resolution.
- Six (6) copies each of Municipal Estimate of Maintenance Costs covering arterial and non-arterial, including Maintenance Engineering Fee Schedule and Unit Cost Sheets.

The maintenance work will be performed on various arterial and non-arterial streets and is similar to the work done last year. A statement regarding this patching work is included in the proposal notifying the contractor that this work will be done by Village forces prior to the seal coat work.

The Maintenance Resolution (Item 1) appropriates the rounded sum of \$14,000 from Motor Fuel Tax funds for this program.

Kindly adopt the attached Resolution and submit two (2) certified copies, along with five (5) copies of the Municipal Estimate of Maintenance Costs (Item 2) and five (5) copies of Proposal Booklets (Item 3) to Mr. James H. Dinkheller, District Engineer, Illinois Division of Highways, 595 South State Street, Elgin, Illinois. The Municipal Request for Funds (Item 4)
