MINUTES of 10-14-63: MOTION by Trustee Long to approve minutes as submitted, 2nd by Trustee Wyatt. Ayes. Trustee Capulli not voting a/c absence from that meeting.

INQUIRIES INVITED FROM FLOOR: No response heard. BIDS CALLED FOR: no response.

ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL LEAGUE 50th CONFERENCE: President Blanke distributed summary.

BURGLAR (HOLD-UP) ALARM SYSTEM-VILLAGE HALL: Proposal received from Howe Elec.Co. read (installers of Fire Alarm System). Total cost for connection thru fire alarm system from V.Hall to Police Station = \$163. MOTION by Trustee McCaw to accept bid, without further competition, seconded by Trustee Shultz. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

TRUCK & SNOWPLOW BIDS: Motion by Trustee Capulli that Clerk open and read bids, 2nd by Trustee Long. Ayes. Freund Bros, Inc., Barrington, bid \$8502.79 less tradein of \$2214.79 = net cost \$6288. E. A. Lusk, Lake Zurich bid \$8816.21 less tradein of \$2100. = net cost \$6716.21. MOTION by Trustee Capulli that bids go to Street Committee for study and report at next meeting, 2nd by Trustee Long. Ayes.

DUTCH ELM DISEASE SPRAY MATERIAL: MOTION by Trustee Long that Clerk open & read bids, 2nd by Trustee Wyatt. Ayes.(Roll call-Ayes:Capulli,McCaw,Long,Shultz,Wyatt.) Bids received from Michlin Chemical @.949¢ and Standard Oil (John F. Speck,Agent).97¢. Pennsalt & Allied Chemical unable to bid. MOTION by Trustee Wyatt that bids go to Street Committee for study and recommendation, 2nd by Trustee Shultz. Ayes. Trustee Long noted that next meeting would be Nov. 11th which would be getting late for spraying this year if purchase delayed until then. Discussion followed. Trustee Capulli stated he felt this having been such a controversial matter, if a decision to purchase is not reached tonight, a full Board should be present when a decision to purchase is made and also before we go any further. Several points for consideration discussed - spot zoning; present building, if approved, would then be acceptable as a business building as it stands and precedent for allowing houses to be changed to business use set up.

AUDIT for year closing 4-30-63 by Putta & Kelsey: presented last meeting. MOTION by Trustee Long that Audit Report for year ending 4-30-63 be accepted, 2nd by Trustee Shultz. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt. Trustee Long suggested meeting with Auditor for discussion of suggestions made.

POLICE PENSION FUND: State Audit made & copy received; briefed by President. Members of Police Pension Board to receive copies thru Chief of Police Muscarello.

BILLS: MOTION by Trustee Long that bills be paid from funds indicated, 2nd by Trustee McCaw. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

SPECIAL USE PERMIT & NOTICE OF PUBLICATION introduced at last meeting re 121 & 127 W. Station St. Discussion had on certain wording & President asked that "Fire Commission" be changed to "Plan Commission" in 3rd line of Notice for Hearing. MOTION by Trustee Capulli that matter of special use for the lots at 121 & 127 W. Station be referred to lan Commission for public hearing, 2nd by Trustee Shultz.Ayes.

PERSONAL & REAL ESTATE TAX ROLL (Ela Twp) Excerpt from FrontierEnterprise of 10-24-63 distributed.

LEAVES - STREET MAINTENANCE: Problem of disposition arises annually. Trustee Wyatt noted that in time for next Fall a proposal will be made by Street Committee for equipment for handling leaves - several types trucks to be studied.

1963 MFT MAINT. PROGRAM CT&A 63-086: Engineers letter advised how \$5172.68 paid to Liberty Asphalt Prod.Inc. should be distributed under MFT accounts.

CHICAGO AERIAL INDUSTRIES INC, request for change in traffic control in their area to Chairman Police Committee for study & recommendation at next regular meeting.

STATE DEPT. PUBLIC WORKS & BLDGS. report on traffic counts made on S. Hough St. at Lincoln Ave. & Hillside Ave. dated 10-24-63 received, advising there is not sufficient traffic - vehicular or foot - to warrant signals as requested. MOTION by Trustee Shultz that this go to Police Committee for further study & report to Board. Second by Trustee Capulli.

BEINHOFF PLAN DEVELOPMENT: Documents covering received tonight. Letter from Village Attorney read; he had consulted with Attorney Braithwaite & checked documents. Trustee Capulli stated he felt, before final action is taken and to insure that all phases and requirements have been covered, Board should study carefully. It was stated this procedure would have effect of planned development. Copies of documents

for all Trustees requested. MOTION by Trustee Long that Ordinance Committee study documents and, at proper time, call meeting of Committee of Whole to discuss matter. 2nd by Trustee Capulli. Meeting set for 10AM Nov 2 (later changed to Nov. 4 at 8 PM)

DISPOSAL PLANT: Consoer, Townsend & Assoc. letter of 10-14-63 re use of potable water for detergent control noted; 2" meter installed to measure amount of pumped water used. MOTION by Trustee Long that letter of authorization be sent Engineers to furnish Village with suitable sketch for installation of pump and associated equipment for washing down of detergent foam, 2nd by Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

PUMP OVERHAULING: Engineers recommended holding off until new well & pumping station installed; pumping of late has been averaging 820M. Trustee Shultz reminded that sometime ago matter of controls for pumping facilities was discussed.

WELL #3: President noted plans & specs ready for advertising for bids; estimated cost from \$14M. to \$15M. MOTION by Trustee Long that Village advertise for bids for drilling & constructing deep well #3 in accordance with Engineers plans & specs, to be received at Village Hall and opened at 8 PM CST Nov. 25, 1963; 2nd by Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, LOng, Shultz, Wyatt. President briefed on various phases involved for improvements of water facilities. Meeting of Committee of Whole and Engineers set for 8 PM on Nov. 4th.

RECESS AT 9.30 PM.

MOTION by Trustee Capulli that Board concur with recommendations of Zoning Board of Appeals for variation as petitioned by Wm. Panker, 2nd by Trustee McCaw. Discussion led by Trustee Wyatt who felt Village invites such variations with such an approval. Roll call - Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long. Noes: Shultz, Wyatt. President-Yes. MOTION by Trustee Capulli that Attorney draw ordinance to cover above seconded by Trustee Long. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

WILLARD PETITION FOR REZONING: Recommendation by Trustee Capulli that Board not concur in recommendations of Plan Commission on regoning of parcel at 213 W.Main St. from R10 to B1 for use as clothing store (1) we would be jumping several residential lots & (2) it would start precedent for using other frame buildings for business property. MOTION by Trustee Capulli that we not concur with recommendation of Plan Commission, seconded by Trustee Long who stated this property lies outside area in Village planned for business and there are vacant business properties in downtown Barrington that could be used for this purpose; the aim of the Board being to keep business district within its present confines with natural growth in business property development. President suggested that if any zoning is done in this area it should be continuous from last business property up to and including this property. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

PUBLIC WORKS BLDG. ELECTRICAL CONTRACT: Trustee Shultz briefed letter from Consoer, Morgan, Architects, that work has been satisfactorily completed, waivers of lien in order, per Attorney; Building Committee recommended and Trustee Shultz MOTIONED that Village Board approve Consoer, Morgan certificate that work by Lageschulte Electric Co. has been completed in accordance with plans & specs and that we, as the Village, authorize payment of \$2949. for all electrical work on the Public Works garage as final & full payment, seconded by Trustee Wyatt. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt. MOTION by Trustee Shultz that List of Bills of 10-28-63 be amended to include payment to Lageschulte Electric Co. in amount of \$2949. Seconded by Trustee Capulli. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

DDT SPRAY PURCHASE: MOTION by Trustee Wyatt that motion to defer report on purchase of DDT spray be reconsidered, 2nd by Trustee Long. Ayes. MOTION by Trustee Wyatt that Village accept bid of Michlin Chemical Co. on 27-55 gal drums of DDT 32.4% at cost of .949¢ per gal. in accordance with terms as set forth in their letter of 10-21.

2nd by Trustee Long with comments: Lengthy discussion followed on pros & cons of spraying for Dutch Elm Disease and the sanitation program. Roll call-Capalli-NO; McCaw-NO: Long-YES: Shultz-NO: Wyatt-NO. MOTION followed by Trustee Wyatt for reconsideration of this vote at next meeting, seconded by Trustee Long. Trustee Capulli stated the only way he would vote for reconsideration would be with 100% attendance of the Board. Further discussion had; President noted that for 6 years Village has had a program and tonight it has been turned down as far as purchase of DDT to continue. Roll call-Capulli-NO; McCaw-NO; Long-YES; Shultz-YES; Wyatt-YES.

HILLSIDE/GROVE AVE.: Trustee Wyatt reported hazardous condition and placed before Board possibility of an ordinance to call this a "school zone area" - between Cook & Summit on Hillside Ave. Chief Muscarello concurred. MOTION by Trustee Wyatt that Attorney be instructed to draw ordinance designating area between Summit St. & Cook St. on Hillside Ave. as being a "school zone". 2nd by Trustee Shultz. Ayes.

LILL ST. IMPROVEMENT: MOTION by Trustee Wyatt that Village reject bid received, seconded by Trustee Long. Ayes.

VOLUNTEER FIREMEN-INSURANCE PLAN: Trustee Stultz briefed on present accident policy with annual premium of \$262.40 due Nov. 9th. Benefits under a new policy being considered explained. Total new premium would be about \$505.88. Insurance Committee recommendation to Board was to consider additional coverage in lieu of increasing compensation to firemen for fire calls. It was agreed by Finance Chairman and Treasurer that money is available. MOTION by Trustee Long that this policy be purchased and that the present policy be cancelled effective immediately; 2nd by Trustee Shultz. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

D. L. KLASS REQUEST: Trustee Capulli explained that Mr. Klass owns 2-60ft.lots on Summit St. & desires to put addition on home; would like to take 10' from 1 lot and add it to improved lot for this purpose. Trustee Capulli discussed this with Attorney B. Matthews and requested an interpretation and opinion in writing. Clerk to forward copy of Klass papers to Attorney Matthews.

NEXT REGULAR BOARD MEETING falls on Veterans Day Nov.11th. MOTION by Trustee Capulli that next regular meeting be held Nov. 12th instead of the 11th which is legal holiday. Second by Trustee Shultz. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt.

POLICE & FIRE BLDG. ARCHITECT: MOTION by Trustee Capulli that President appoint a Committee of 3 Board members to meet with various architects on the matter of Police & Fire Bldg. and, within 90 to 120 days, Committee would report to Board and final recommendation would be given Board after that date. 2nd by Trustee Shultz. Trustee Long suggested that architect selected cooperate with Village and neighbors of the - print property for beautification of the area. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, McCaw, Long, Shultz, Wyatt. When Trustee Capulli requested selection of Committee tonight it was decided President should have decision on Committee members ready for next Board meeting.

MEETING ADJOURNED on motion by Trustee Shultz, seconded by Trustee Long - 10.50 PM.

DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIONS

Now, on this 26th day of October, 1963, comes The First National Bank and Trust Company of Barrington, Barrington, Illinois, a national bank association, as Trustee under the provisions of a Trust Agreement dated the 5th day of April, 1900, known as Trust No. 15, owner of the property described below, and states that the following restrictions shall apply to the respective property for a period ending on December 31, 1988. Said restrictions shall run with the land and be binding upon all present and future owners, their heirs, successors, assigns, executors, administrators, and representatives. This Declaration of Restrictions has been entered into upon the consideration of the granting of certain rezoning of some of the property described herein by the Village of Barrington and these restrictions may be enforced by said Village of Barrington.

1. The following described property shall be utilized only for single family residences and there shall be not more than one single family residence on each lot:

Lots 9 through 15, inclusive, of Walbaum's Addition to Barrington, part of the west half of the north-east quarter of Section 1, Township 42 North, Range 9, East of the Third Principal Meridian, Cook County, Illinois.

2. The following described property shall be utilized only for not more than one multiple dwelling building containing not more than twelve (12) dwelling units, said building to be not more than two stories in height, excluding basements, and said building to be constructed in substantial architectural conformity with a certain drawing thereof on file with the Village Clerk of the Village of Barrington, marked "Exhibit A to Declaration of Restrictions" and further marked as No. 362, 6-27-63; said building shall be placed on such portion of the premises as to be in substantial compliance with a certain drawing entitled "Development of Lots A and B, Walbaum's

Addition to Barrington", dated September 9, 1963, marked "Exhibit B to Declaration of Restrictions" and on file with the Village Clerk of the Village of Barrington:

Lot A in Owner's Subdivision of Sundry Lots in Walbaum's Addition to Barrington of part of the west half of the northeast quarter of Section 1, Township 42 North, Range 9, East of the Third Principal Meridian, according to the plat thereof filed in the office of the Registrar of Titles of Cook County, Illinois, as document No. 580312, except that part of said Lot described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of said Lot, thence northwesterly along the southwesterly line of said Lot, 146.32 feet to the southwest corner thereof; thence north along the west line of said Lot, 140.28 feet; thence southeasterly to a point in the east line of said Lot, 140 feet north of the southeast corner thereof; thence south along said east line 140 feet to the place of beginning; and

except the north 420 feet of said Lot A.

3. The following described property shall have erected thereon not more than two (2) multiple family dwelling buildings, each said building to contain not more than twelve (12) family dwelling units and each said building to be not more than two (2) stories in height, excluding basements, said buildings to be constructed in substantial architectural conformity with a certain drawing on file with the Village Clerk of the Village of Barringson, marked "Exhibit A to Declaration of Restrictions" and further marked No. 362, 6-27-63; said buildings shall be placed on such portion of the premises to be in substantial compliance with a certain drawing entitled "Development of Lots A and B, Walbaum's Addition to Barrington", dated September 9, 1963, marked "Exhibit B to Declaration of Restrictions" and on file with the Village Clerk of the Village of Barrington:

The south 360 feet of the north 480 feet of Lot B, in Owner's Subdivision of Sundry Lots in Walbaum's Addition to Barrington of part of the west half of the northeast quarter of Section 1, Township 42 North, 9, East of the Third Principal

Meridian, according to the plat thereof filed in the office of the Registrar of Titles of Cook County, Illinois, as document No. 580312.

Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, upon the issuance by the Village of Barrington of a building permit for the respective properties, after filing of plan and specifications, the restrictions contained in paragraph 2 or 3 of these restrictions as the case may be, shall be deemed to have been complied with and shall thereafter be enforceable only in the event of subsequent requests for a building permit or subsequent requests for changes or alterations to plans and specifications.

We think it advisable, as design and details proceed, to update this estimate. Two principal items make this updating advisable: The finally determined shape and size of the reservoir increases its net capacity from 600,000 to 678,000 gallons. It appears advisable to include installation of a new forced draft aerator on the existing reservoir. The revised budget estimate is attached. The Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Alinois Municipal League was held in Springfield October 19, 21, 20 and 22. Conference meetings were held in Hotel Leland, Hotel Abraham Lincoln, Hotel St. Michelas, Elks Clup, and Masonic Temple. Registered attendance was nearly 2,000 municipal officials.
