Report on Bulk Mailing

COST

Regular bulk rate - 5¢ per piece under 5 oz. in weight

Charge for qualified non-profit organization - 1.7¢ per piece under 5 oz.

Cost of mailing service we now use is approximately \$ 372.00 a year

" " " regular Bulk Rate would be approx. \$ 295.00 " "

Above figures are based on mailings of 550 pieces except for Art Fair. Art Fair was allowed one mailing of 6000 pieces and another mailing of 350 pieces. Three cards and three letters from Club President to all members and mailing of the Year Book in addition to Art Fair mailings are included in the figures calculated. Year Books are mailed third class for 12¢.

If we are not granted Non-profit status we would be allowed Bulk Rate for all mailings of 350 or more pieces mailed at one time. There is also the possibility that the Federal Government might decide we should pay income tax (probably around \$ 20.00 a year).

Cost comparison after 1st year - \$373.00 - present way

335.00 - reg. Bulk Rate

141.10 - Non-profit privilege

REQUIREMENTS TO SECURE BULK RATE OR NON-PROFIT PERMIT

1. Each mailing must be of 350 or more pieces
2. Only one return address may be used for all Club mailings
3. Application for permit must be made to local Post Master. He in turn sends this to the regional Post Master for approval. If all requirements are met permit could be available in two weeks.
4. Permit no. must be printed on each item mailed. A meter could be used instead but the cost of rental is \$35.00 per month and purchase price would be prohibitive for us. Mr. Holke would print permit no. on all envelopes he processed for no extra charge.
5. Mail must be sorted and a form filled out at time of each mailing. Mailer would pay cost of mailing in cash or by Treasure's check.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR NON-PROFIT APPLICATION

1. A copy of mailings sent during previous year, our financial records and our Constitution and By-Laws must accompany our application.
2. We must have an Employer's Identification Number from both State and Federal Income Tax Offices. (We now have one from the State but not Federal Office)

Present Status with I. R. S.

In 1968 our treasurer at that time, Evelyn Krause, filled an income tax and requested that we be advised whether or not we qualified as Non-profit. She had no reply and did not file again, trusting that "no news was good news". Evelyn is now our financial advisor. She says it would not be difficult to file for the years since 1968. Our copy of 1968 returns is in the Treasurer's files.

John Putta (CPA) referred me to the tax specialist with his firm. He examined our records and with-out a thorough search advised that in his opinion we would qualify. If we do not qualify, our annual tax based on last year's figures would probably be around \$20.00.

POINTS TO BE CONSIDERED IN REACHING A DECISION

1. All bulk mailings are handled as third class and service would be slower.
2. Savings for regular Bulk Rate would only be about \$41.00 a year at present rates and at our present volume. (After 1st year)
3. The necessity of using a P. O. Box and additional processing at time of each mailing are both added inconveniences.
4. We might end up paying an income tax.
5. Savings if we were granted Non-profit permit could be as much as \$232.30 a year.
