Minutes of the Board of Governors Barrington Woman's Club, June 3, 1975

Minutes of the Board of Governors

Barrington Woman's Club - July 1, 1975

The July meeting of the Board of Governors of the Barrington Woman's Club was held at the home of Estelle Girard and was called to order at 9:30ca.m. by the President, Norma Carey.

The roll call was taken and the following members were absent: Virginia Baker, Evelyn Krause, Ellen Smith, Renee Clauson, Marion Barch, Jan Nemeth, Martina Madden, Grace Wytmar, June Foy, and Lee Nelsen. There were 22 members present. Norma Carey suggested that the names of June Foy and Lee Nelsen be deleted from future roll calls.

The minutes of the June meeting were read, amended and accepted.

Treasurer, Estelle Girard read her report. It was moved by Jean Dake and seconded by Catherine Gallagher that the report be accepted and filed for audit.

Minutes of the Board of Governors

Barrington Woman's Club - November 4, 1975
