MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS BARRINGTON WOMAN'S CLUB, JUNE 6, 1978

The meeting was called to order at 9:45 am in the meeting room of the Barrington Library by President Jean Dake. She thanked Grace Wytmar for serving as hostess.

Roll call was taken and the following members were absent: Catherine Harkins, Bea Edwards, and Carolyn Disko. A quorum was present.

The President distributed the Newsletter which included the names of the new Board of Governors. She apologized for misspelling Elsie Yaffe's name and explained the new Board position. Evelyn Krause will serve as Coordinator- Barrington Activities which will include the United Fund (Evelyn Krause and Jean Schroeder), Historical Society (Tina Madden), Friends of the Library (Audrey DeCook), BAAK (Grace Wytmar), and the Hospital Auxiliary (Jan Nemeth).

She announced that the next Board meeting will be at the Library on Tuesday, July 11th instead of the 4th.

The minutes of the May Board meeting were read and approved.

Estelle Girard read the Treasurer's report which was accepted to be filed for audit. She read a letter from Harper College thanking us for our donation to their project for the continuing education of hearing impaired adults.

Estelle reported that to date the profits on the Cook Book amount to \$5,916.48. There are still about 200 books remaining to be sold but about 63 of them are damaged. This means we have reached our goal of \$6,000.00 in two years instead of the planned five years. The books of the Club are closed on July 1 and & check for \$4800.00 in fulfillment of our pledge will be given the Library at that time after the interest is collected on July 1st.

The sale of the remaining books will bring our profit to more than \$6,000.00 and there was some discussion about the use of the extra money. Helen Jantz reported that the Duplicate Bridge group would like to meet at the Library but there are no card tables available. She moved that the Club purchase twelve card tables at a cost not to exceed \$200.00 using the extra profit from the Cook Book sales. These tables are to be marked, "Donated by the Barrington Woman's Club" and presented to the Library. Motion seconded and carried.

Estelle would like the profits from the Cook Book sales over and above the amount donated to the Library put in to the Philanthropy account to facilitate her book-keeping. This will be discussed in July after an investigation of any statement of purpose in the Cook Book.

The following Committee reports were made:

Philanthropy-Scholarships - Enid Reed - no report

Programs - Tina Madden presented an outstanding schedule of programs for next year. She was congratulated on her plans.

House and Social - Norma Henschen reported that most of the needed facilities have been lined up.

Collectors Group - Elsie Yaffe presented the schedule of programs for next year and was also congratulated on her list.

Yearbook - Catherine Harkins has asked that two copies of lists of committee personnel be given to Estelle Girard in her absence.

Corresponding Secretary - Rosemary Wolfe - no report.

Friendship Chairman - Jean Krueger raised the question of obtaining notepaper with the Club logo. Rosemary Wolfe will investigate the current supply and report at the July meeting. Jean also asked to be notified of illness or death in the family of Woman's Club members.

Advisors - No report

Art - June Brandvik reported no planned activities until Fall.

Home Arts and Crafts - Lucy Henry reported in the absence of Bea Edwards plans for a Craft Activity Day the second Wednesday of every month and other interesting events.

Newsletter- Marie Beaubien requested that all items for the Newsletter be submitted in writing the morning of the Board meetings so the Newsletter may be sent out in time.

Conservation - Mildred Prall reported they plan to concentrate their study and tours on remnants of the Prairies.

Literature - Carolyn Disko. The group plans to meet at the Library and has some interesting programs scheduled.

Recreational Activities - Helen Jantz announced they will be offering the same activities and hope to start a Yoga class.

Travelers - Marion Tibbetts would like an indication of the kinds of trips they should be planning.

Art Fair - Marilyn Haayen announced plans for the Fair were progressing. She also reported that the profits on the Antique Patr amount to #1,014.91 at this time with all bills paid. There is still a small amount to be collected and the total may be about \$1,050.00. They plan to repeat it - possibly earlier in April next year and hope to make even more money with more time to plan.

There was some discussion about the use of the money and the possibility of holding it until after the pace next year in order to present the Hospital with a more substantial item. Marilyn will investigate the possibilities and it will be considered at the July meeting.

Budget - Lucy Henry presented the budget that was submitted in April to the new Board members. She moved that it be approved. Motion seconded and carried.

Reception - Julia Sowko reported her committee list is complete and plans are well in hand.

Membership - Ann Schuh reported that we had 406 members in May. As of June 5th we had 58 paid members for the new year. It was moved that we accept the new members proposed. Motion seconded and carried.

Public Relations - Mary Jo Weiler requested that each interest group send in their own publicity and clip their items. One of her committee members will do all the clipping for the History.

Revisions - Grace Wytmar asked for revision suggestions for job descriptions in the Board Manuals and reminded the new chairmen to obtain their Board Manuals from their predecessors.
