He was asked by the ed of the local n vspaper to describe his experiences on 7 Dec 4 In HI, where he was stationed. His story was se fascinating that instead of printing only the highlights, he had decided to run the whole article in 3 successive editions. George prepared his bio so completely that only certain excerpts follow. He lives in a very attractive apt on the town park, with a wonderful view of the OH River flowing by. He arranged for his daughter Susan, who lives in Columbus, OH-about 113 mi away--to graciously join us, and served a delightful tea party. 


