SENATE RESOLUTION

By Mr. Jamieson, of Mercer County

Introduced and Adopted by the Senate April 29, 1940

Whereas, The late Captain Robert M. Losey, military attache for the United States in Norway, while engaged in the performance of his duty of evacuating Americans from the danger zone in that nation was killed during a German air raid at Dombass, Norway; therefore,

Be It Resolved, That the members of the Senate of the State of New Jersey extend their deepest sympathy to the family of the late Captain Robert M. Losey; and that the Senate of the State of New Jersey also extend its sympathy to those thousands of other innocent victims of the aggressive, cruel and barbaric invasion of a neutral nation whose only crime was in seeking to maintain unto itself those liberties which we in America are so privileged to enjoy.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this resolution be signed by the President of the Senate, attested by its Secretary and sent to Captain Losey's widow, Mrs. Kae Banta Losey, Hollywood, California, and to his sister, Mrs. Margaret Lee, Douglaston, Long Island.

Dear Mrs. Lee:

You will probably be very surprised to be receiving a letter after all these years from the Class of 1924 of Trenton High School.

This letter is in reference to your brother, Bob Losey, who was a member of our class. He was well known and well liked by all his classmates. We believe and understand your brother Bob was the first casualty of World War II. The United States was not in the war at this time but Bob and others had gone to Norway to evacuate American citizens.

It had long been the thought of Dr. William Wetzel, the then principal of Trenton High, that our class should put a memorial of some kind in the school in memory of Bob. We have talked about doing something for a long time. We regret that due to the lack of funds in our class treasury we have never been able to do anything until now.

On October 4, 1980, at 11 A.M., the Class of 1924 is dedicating a bronze plaque which is being put in the War Memorial Building in Trenton in memory of your brother. We expect to have a General from Fort Dix speak and some other dignitaries present. Following the ceremonies, we will have luncheon at the Trenton Country Club at 1 P.M.

This letter is an invitation for you to attend the ceremonies and luncheon as our guest. We hope that if you have no other plans, you will be able to be present.

We would appreciate it if you could tell us anything else about Bob. Was he married and if so did he leave any family? We want to be sure to contact all of his family, and living relatives, if possible.


