On Reading the Bible

HE really great interest of life is religion and the real value of religion is its value for life. The world's most essential books are those that do the most for the lives of men in bringing God to them and in bringing them into direct contact with God. Nothing else equals in worth such things as love, personal character, truth, righteousness, spiritual well-being, and the like. Life, therefore, is always interested in the history of those movements which mean most for religionthe movements of God toward men and the search of men after God. The Holy Scriptures stand in a class by themselves as the record of God's revelation of himself to men, his concern and purpose for them, and his daily interest in their daily lives. The Holy Scriptures stand alone among religious books, also, as showing the true ways for men to God, how to understand him, how to get into personal, friendly relations with him, how to live in daily fellowship and harmony with him, how to keep constant the contact with God which will enable him to do the most for life and enable men to renew their lives day by day.

The purpose of this schedule of Bible reading is essentially practical. No wise person believes that there is any magical value in reading a definite portion of the Bible each day or in reading the whole of it in any year. We are not after magical results either when we pray or when we read the Word of God. In both acts we are trying to expose the soul and mind, the whole precious life of a person, to the living influence of the living God, and to lift the whole self up to him for grace, help, and strength. In the Scriptures we see how others have done it. We see how God came to them, what God meant to them, and how he blessed them in their lives. And the more we see of all this in the lives of other men the better it looks for our lives. Those

who have made the best use of these Scriptures through the Christian centuries have most nearly become the kind of men they ought to have become. The outcome in other lives makes it look like a thing we cannot afford to lose or miss in our own.

These books from Genesis to Revelation are not all alike, and no one of them will work magically or automatically upon any person, but they are all worth knowing as giving us knowledge of God's character and ways with men, and light on the path of life we are all walking. Above all they give men an acquaintance with Jesus Christ and the redeeming God whom Jesus Christ perfectly re reals. And there is no other book which does this. This makes this Book the supreme book for human life, the supreme record of religious experience, the wonderful story of the life of God in mankind, with mankind and for mankind; the life of man seeking and finding God in all the sundry times and divers manners of the centuries and perfectly at last and now in Jesus Christ. What the Bible does for those who constantly, regularly, sensibly, and reverently use it makes it an abiding gift of God to his children.

This makes it a lamp to the feet and a light upon the paths of men on their way to God, on their way with God through his world.

Many students in many lands have asked me why they should read the Bible. The general answer is, of course, because of what is in it and what comes out of it. Life is in it—"spirit and life"—life comes out of it to those who open their own lives to it. Above all the life of God in Christ is in it, and that life comes out of it to those who seek him in its pages.


