Commissioner Garfield Fails to Find Proof of Existence of Beef Trust

DECLARES PROFITS ARE SMALL

Make Less Than 2 Per Cent on Total Sales, Although Six Leading Con-cerns Slaughter 45 Per Cent of Cattle.

Chicago dispatch: Commissioner Garfield's report on the dressed meat industry, which was transmitted to congress by President Rousevell Fricay, will not interfere with the grand jury investigation into the operations of the packers, to commence in Catego March 90, according to Assistant United States District Attorney Charles B. Morrison.

Mr. Garfield, as commissioner of corporations, reports the result of his Enguires into the business of Armour & Co., Swift & Co., Neison Morris & Co., Swift & Co., Wester Company and the Cudally Packing Company, and the Cudally Packing Company, He says these six concerns in 1902 slaughtered about 45 per cent of the total indicated slaughter, in the United States; that for three of the year 1902 instead of being one of coorbitant profits was less profitable than usual; that during the months some at least of the leading packers were actually losing money on every beed slaughtered.
