An Astembble Fire Department.

The municipal authorities of Vienna have determined to abandon the use of horses to draw their fire apparatus and to equip their service entirely on an automobile basis, says Harper's Weekly. The Vienna fire department is considered the best equipped of continental Europe, and within ten years it has replaced all obsolete apparatus with the most modern and useful devices. The first step taken was the ordering of fifty-three motor chemical engines and wagons to replace those previously drawn by horses and which are most useful for dealing with small first.
