Shippers' President Desires to Add to Evidence Already Submitted.

SENATORS WOULD CLOSE CASE

Members of the Committee are Desir ious of Ending the Inquiry in On-der to Devote Their Time to a Study of the Testimony.

Washington special: The shippers of the country do not propose to permit the senate committee on interstate commerce to formulate any measure for presentation to the senate which shall stuttly the wish of the people for an equitable adjustment of the railroad rate question.

Senator Elkins, chairman or the committee has determined to bring the hearings to a close with the termination of the testimony of the railroad officials and attorneys, believing the country to be ro saturated with help views it might forget the injustice suffered by shippers. 
