A system of submarine signaling which, according to the officers of the Korth German Lloyd liner Kaiser Wilbelm det Grosse, which recently arrived at New York, is destined greatly to minimise the dangers of fog and mist to ocean liners when they are nearing shore has been fitted to the three great North German liners—Kaiser Wilhelm III. Kroupring Wilhelm and Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse—ays the New York Times. The apparatus, which the Kaiser Wilhelm officers declare has proved a complete subcess, consists of a small tank filled with a special solution of greater density than water, which is attached to the inner akin of the liner's hull and which conwater, which is attached to the inner skin of the liner's buil and which con-tains a microphone or transmitter. General Baden-Powell, one of the
picturesque beroes of the South African war, has been letting in light upon
the airship for practical use. The gencral la' president of the Aeronautical
society of Great Britialn and recently
contributed some interesting history

The original inventor of the airship,
Centeral Baden-Powell asserts, was M.
Offfard, who constructed one in Paris
in 1852. Giffard's machine was supplied with a steam engine, rotating a

Offinally, who consistences one in a line in 1852. Gifferal's machine was supplied with a steam engine, rotating a serve propeller. In 1884 the Prench government constructed an airelah with a propeller driven by an electric motor. This machine traveled twenty-free minutes, and another in 1902 made a voyage of sixty-free miles. General Baden-Powell's discussion shows that little progress has been made since 1884 toward perfectling the balloon airship and that the real innovation is the dright machine. He thinks that the aerial machine of the future may combine several of the details of the best contrivances now under experiment and that engineers and investigators generally agree that the vestigators generally agree that the ly presents no insuperable obstacles.
