Gen. Mistchenko's Command, 5,000 Strong, Is Driven Back by Oyama.

TURNING MOVEMENT IS BEGUN

Tokio cablegram: Field Marshal Oyama has begun a general advance. He routed 5,000 cavalry, part of Gen-Mistobenko's command, and occupied Lioaynapopeng, sirty miles southwest of Gunshu pass, which is the bead-quarters of Gen. Linevited, commanders in chief of the Russian army.

The Japanese advance indicates that the long expected turning move supported to the last been in supparation of the last been in supparation army, has begun.

The Russians were panic atricken on the retreat and burned provisions and stores. Other minor engagements resulted favorably to the Japanese to the west had been practically stationary for three months about twenty miles north of Tieling, where pursuit of the Russians halted after the battle of Mukden. During this interval the beligherents were thirty miles apart. Only skirmiabse occurred until June 11, when the Japanese made a rush, advancing twenty miles. Field Marshal Oyama announces that the second rush was made on June 10, the Japanese occupying the 10 mile line.
