## CUT AND WIRE NAILS

METHODS BY WHICH THEY ARE TURNED OUT IN VAST QUANTITIES.

The Wire Nail Process is Simple and Almost Wholly Automatic, While the Cut Nail Process is Less Auto-matic and Much Harder.
