Mrs. Bennett died July 14, 1874, and on Oct. 15, two years later, the de-ceased took unto himself another helpmeet by marrying Ida Coggen, who survives him. Four children were born to this second union—Charles L., living in Florida; Sanford L., re-siding in Minnesota; Robert A. and Francis Lovell, living in this city.

Mr. Bennett was engaged in agri-cultural pursuits near Lake Zurich up to a few years ago, when he retired and made a home for his family in Barrington in which to spend the rest

LAKE BLUFF WINS OUT.

LAKE BLUFF WINS OUT.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 29—|Special.|—Efforts of interested parties to have the government abandon Lake fibility as a site for the naval training station have failed in their beginning. Rear Admiral Converse, chief of the bureau of navigation, who has charge of all naval stations, will submit to Secretary Bonaparte tomorrow a recommendation that congress be asked to make a large appropriation during the coming session for use during the fiscal year 1906-01 in the construction of barracks, offices, and other improvements at Lake Illeff. The appropriation of \$250,000 now available is being expended in surveying, clearing the land, and in preparation for the work of construction. Plans have been prepared for the creation of a station which will cost in the neighborhood of \$200,000. At first accommodations will be provided for 2,000 boys.
