Recently the council for the policy holders of the Equitable Life gave to the public some very interesting facts about the business of life insurance in this country. According to this authority, thirty old line companies located here have out 21,000,000 policies, covering about 10,000,000 lives. The aggregate amount of insurance received in these policies is about \$13,000,000,000, and the premiums on them for 1904 amounted to nearly \$500,000,000. The total assets of these thirty companies in 1904 were over \$2,500,000,000 and their total income for that year over \$400,000,000. Nearly one-half of the total assets in 1904 were held by three companies.

It goes without saying that the control of this vast capital invested in life insurance business is controlled by a very few men, comprising the executive officers of the companies. It has been suggested, and the Equitable counsel agrees with this view, that supervision of insurance remain in the hands of several states, as at present, and that stricter laws be made, even to the fixing of a legal limit to the size of companies. But it would seem that uniform legislation in regard to regulating the insurance business in a manner to protect all policy holders would be impossible. Federal supervision is open to serious objection, but it is well to recognize at the outset that the national government alone has the power to enact measures of radical reform for the whole country and to enforce them.
