A Balloon Incline Railroad.
Congaul William Bardel writes from Bambery that Engineer Balderauer, of Saltberg, has invented a balloon railroad, experiments with which are now being made in the mountain the neighborhood of allonary balloon, which is fastened to a silder running along a single steel rail.
