A NEW FACTORY PROJECTED

Chicago Company Wants to Establish Canning Factory in Barrington.

The second solicitor of a canning concern, who have headquarters in Chicago, has come to town yesterday and is attempting to interest Barrington men and farmers in establishing a canning factory.

The project, as outlined to one of our business men by the projectors, is as follows:

The company expects to have

canning facilities at a cost of \$100,000.

They will buy 150 shares of stock at \$100 each.

The stockholders would

own 10 per cent of the factory.

The company would expect

the stockholders 5 per cent on their

investment, after that they would

make the usual charge for canning

the products, such as, sweet corn,

peas, beans, tomatoes, etc., would

receive the balance of whatever the

canned goods brought in the market.

Additional stockholders and

stockholders would be required to sup-

port a factory of the size contempla-

ted, and it is expected by the projectors

that those favoring this section

would be willing to sow five acres

each, the receipts of which the com-

pany expects would average \$50 an

acre.

The factory would employ in the

fall about 100 hands, mostly girls and

boys.
