LIVES OF NEARLY 100 MEN ARE SNUFFED OUT.

Damp Explosion and Fall Cage Cause of Two Terrible Disasters.

Two hundred and ten men were in the mine when the news was spread to the villagers near by that a terrible disaster had occurred. Son almost the whole population of the countryside gathered at the mouth of the shaft, among them being the was falling heavily and the most distressing seenes of brief were witnessed as the bodies were brought up by two and threes and laid out under a blaze of electric lights. Many of the balse of electric lights. Many of the bodies were so disfigured by the force of the explosion that they were scarcily recognizable. The work of bringing out the injured men and the bodies of the dead was very slow, the galleries being choked with wreck-age.


