"Telemegraphone" May Supplant the Unintelligible Station "Barker.",

New York—The telemegraphone, the newest device for reducing wear and tear on human throats, is being tried for the first time at the Grand Central station by the New York Central road. If, after a fair trial, the individual station of the station attendants will be dispensed with. The telemegraphone consists mainly of seven large brass horns distributed over the station. These horns are connected by wires with a centrally situated booth. A railroad employe standing inside this booth speaks about the trains in a mouthplece resembling somewhat a telephone mouthplece and the words are carried to the seven brass horns by the wires.
