Springfield, Ill, July 11.—Under the administration of Gov. Denees the state charitable institutions have entered upon one of the greatest periods of advancement in the history of illinois. The state apparently for many years had been too heavily burdened to keep pace in its charitable service with the advancement made during the last quarter of a century by medical, architectural and entineering science. A part of this unoney will be used to improve the service-in the charitable institutions, to erect new buildings, chiefly of the hospital type, and to begin a thorough rehabilitation of existing buildings and equipment.

Denees, when he appointed the present state board of charities, saked the board to work out plans ultimately to make the 17 charitable institutions of Illinois to the level of that of the most progressive American states. The board worked out such plans. They were submitted to the general assembly.
