CASABLANCA SHELLED

MOORISH CITY IS BOMBARDED BY FRENCH CRUISERS.

MANY MOORS ARE SLAIN

Tangier-Casabiance, on the Moroccan coast, has been bombarded by French cruisers, the Moors are reported to have been shot down in large numbers, and the town, since last Saturday night, has been practically in the possession of landing parties from French and Spanish cruisers.

The first shots were fired by the Moors. The Frenchmen responded with a bayonet charge and the bombardment of the native quarter with melinite shells. The Frenchmen had six men wounded, but no one killed No.
