

numerical count of known animal
species. This kind of attempt is surly not without interest, but it must be
naknowledged that its results are very
uncertain. We are far from knowing
all species, and there is yet a delighful prospect ahead for those who love
systematic soology and for noologists
who bestow mutual honors by giving
each other's names to some animal
hitherto unknown.

Mammalium," the species of rodents
