Four children survive him—Guatave, now king, born June 16, 1838; Prince Occar Bernadotte, born November 15, 1859. Prince Carl, born February 27, 1861, and Prince Eugene, born August 1, 1865. Gustave was married September 20, 1881, to Princes Victoria of Edon-Baden. Their eldest son, Prince Occar, was married June 18, 1906, to Princess Margaret Victoria of Consusuch. 
