It is with much sorrow that we chronicle the death of Mrs. Mary Leonard Nate, wite of Rev. John Nate, who was at one time for of the Barrington M. E. church. Mary Leonard Nate was borr, at Rigaston, Outario, August 21ed, 1826 and died at her-home in Chiengo on December 2nd, 1908. She was the daughter of Rev.
