When marching out on the floor of the Coliseum to kill and be killed, passing by the throne of Caesar, they cried out: "We who are about to die salute thee!"



In the twentieth century the bulls have been sub-stituted for gladiators. Caesar gave his entertain-ments free to the freedmen, as he wanted favors and ments free to the freedmen, as he wanted favors and moded their votes. The rulers of Mexico favor bull fights and gambling. Lotteries they conduct in the name of the state. The people must be amused and forget about a representative government. When Mexico becomes a republic in reality and not merely in name—though that time looks far off at present— there will be no more bull fights.
