William Spumner, Well Known and Wealthy Elmhurst Township Farmer and T. W. Mattison of This Village Both Die Saturday Morning.

MORTIMER W. MATTISON, aged 38 years, died from tuberculosis Saturday morning at four o'clock at the home of his parents, Rev. and Mrs. Orlin F. Mattison of Cook street.

Mr. Mattison was born January 9, 1874, at the Elmhurst, where his father was a minister of the Methodist Episcopal church. He was educated from the Illinois high school, and from the Northwestern university at Evanston in 1895 and two years later from the Northwestern law school, after which he practiced law in the bar, and had practiced law for 14 years. He was attorney for the Chicago and North Western Railway for four years, from 1901 to 1905. He was city attorney of Evanston. He was a member of the Bar Association when his father, Rev. O. F. Mattison, was appointed to the Methodist parish of Evanston. He has been in the law since that time. He was born in Illinois to a great deal of work. He was a worker for the American League of Illinois and active in the local option fight here two and four years ago.

He had a father and mother, he leaves three sisters, Miss Myrtle F. Mattison, a teacher in the Chicago public schools, Miss Walter F. Mattison, a husband is a professor in the university at Oxford, Ohio, and Mrs. C. E. Mattison of Evanston. Two brothers, Hugh B. Mattison of Park Ridge and Robert S. Mattison of Chicago, conducted the funeral services Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The body was taken to the home of his father and mother in Evanston for burial Monday.

William Spumner, a prominent and wealthy farmer of his township, died at his home at 10 o'clock Saturday morning at his home on west of Lake Zurich. The body was developed from infection of wounds received December 28 when he was dragged over a quarter of a mile across the road from Lake Zurich to his residence by the team which he was driving. When rescued his foot was so badly injured the sprain of which he had been riding. He was taken to his home by Dr. H. H. Hoffer. Dr. Hoffer was born on the farm in his township on August 26, 1846. In December, 1869, he was married to Frances A. Porter who died two years later. To them one son was born, George W. Spumner, of this village.

Mr. Spumner was a husband and father and a good farmer and with his brother, Joseph, who died in February 1905, had a considerable fortune. He was a charter member of the Lake Zurich camp of Modern Woodmen of America at the time the death was serving his eighth term as commander of the lodge.
