Has Invited the Farmers Industrial Association and All Farmers to Meet at His Farm June 27.

FARM IS ONE OF BEST IN COUNTY

Affair Promises to be One of the Biggest of Its Kind Held in County in Long Time—Talks to Given.

Samual Insell through the Farmers Industrial association has invited an farmer of Lake county to spend a day on his beautiful farm in DeKalb, Illinois, for the purpose of giving a demonstration.

begin largely on the two topics of soil and animal husbandry, men who are particularly interested in these subjects will be present, to discuss them; a full program will appear as a later date.
