HOOF-AND-MOUTH DISEASE NEAR HERE

Farmers Urged to Watch for Signs of Disease in Their Cattle

MEETINGS OF FARMERS FORBIDDEN

Dr. O. E. Dyer, State Veterinarian, Chief of the Illinois Bureau of Animal Industry, Orders all Meetings of Farmers to be Suspended

Dr. O. E. Dyer, State Veterinarian, Chief of the Illinois Bureau of Animal Industry, orders all meetings of farmers to be suspended in the country around Barrington and warns farmers of the danger of the spread of Foot-and-Mouth disease in this community.

The Foot-and-Mouth disease has broken out in this vicinity and is serious.

The board of health of Barrington township through one of its members, John C. Plagge, urges all especially farmers to stay themselves in keeping the disease from spreading.

Dr. Albert Gluck, assistant State Veterinarian, states that every case of the disease is a serious one. He says that the owner of the herd killed by the authorities yesterday was a man who would not believe that the disease could spread so fast but is now convinced and ready to warn others.

Dr. O. E. Dyer, State Veterinarian, has ordered that there be no meetings of farmers in this vicinity, that no animals be taken to any place where they must be kept close and that in case of the disease must stay in the herd.

On October 20, William Ripper, who lives a mile and a half west of the Chicago stock yards, on November 25, or nearly a week later, one of the cows suddenly developed Foot-and-Mouth disease which ran through the entire herd in a day's time. They were killed yesterday and buried.

William Ripper, owner of the victim, has 25 cows and 15 pigs which are to be killed this week.

August Nelson, whose cattle in care of his brother, are in the Chicago stock yards, two miles south of the victim, to which he expects to move his herd, will also shortly be killed.

All these animals have the disease in various degrees. These facts are enough to make all cattle men realize that precautions are necessary and that danger of infection is not stamped out in the countryside as it was believed. So much has been publicized in every paper and many magazines about the Foot-and-Mouth disease that now information seems to be everywhere.

Advises may be secured without charge through Dr. Gluck, representing the State Bureau of Animal Industry.
