**87,000 MEN IN
FIRST DRAFT CALL**

President Issues Order Calling
Soldiers Into the Service
of United States.

262,985 MEN IN THE ARMY

War Department Announces the Quota to Be Furnished by Each State—Credit Given for Men Now in Service.

Washington.—The war department has promulgated a formal order for the president: drafting 687,000 men into military service of the United States under the selective conscription law. The order shows what part of the total must be furnished by each state.

the National Guard and every man it has contributed since April 1 as a war volunteer to the regular army.

Computation Method.

Placing on the debit side of the ledger the national army of 500,000, the entire National Guard at war strength and the number of war volunteers

The men summoned for service will be used to fill the regular army and National Guard to war strength and organize the first 500,000 of the new National army.

Total to 1,282,985.

The total of these three forces will be 1,282,985 men, which is the number needed on April 1, 1918, to bring the regulars up to the war strength, the army reserve was apportioned according to population.

This gave a gross quota for each state, from which a net quota was computed by checking-off the number of National Guardsmen available for federal service and the number of foreign-born.
