Mail Income Tax Return Saturday

It is announced this morning that there will be no extension of time for filing the mail income tax return.

This is a decision of the U. S. Collector or Julius F. Spangler.

Under the new revenue law, which takes effect April 1, there will be no extension, just as there was in the mail.

—Convert Liberty Bond to 4%.

The treasury department has pro-

claimed May 15 and Jan 15 the dates

when the public will have the privilege of converting their

gold bonds into 4% bonds.

This gives the owners of more than \$20,000,000 of bonds an opportunity to

get a one-quarter of 1% per cent in

interest on the face of the bonds—

to the public.

Thus, the half owners of these

bonds neglected or refused to convert

in the six months end. Now

they have the opportunity to convert

them back into 4% bonds.

the same interest as the public.
