### DUTIES OF A COMMUNITY NURSE

Defined in an Address Delivered by Mrs. Rose C. Armstrong, R. N.

Tuesday of last week, at the meeting of the Baptist Women's Missionary society held in the home of Mrs. Stewart, the duties of a community nurse were defined by Mrs. Rose C. Armstrong, R. N., who recently assumed that position in Barrington.

In the course of her remarks Mrs. Armstrong said in part:

"The community nurse is a caring woman of social work in which the health of a community is concerned and in which her training for her profession comes into play."

"She combines in one person the duties of an infant, welfare nurse, a school nurse, a tuberculosis nurse, and a district or visiting nurse."

"In the infant welfare work the nurse makes systematic, regularly timed visits to the babies in the community, keeping a watchful eye on their progress. She is ready with advice to the mothers, especially during the feeding and weaning period. During the summer months the babies are under her constant observation, and in case of illness the mothers are referred to the pediatrician."

"In addition she holds weekly meetings at the Infant Welfare work where the mothers can bring their babies to be examined, weighed and vaccinated by a doctor who explains them to understand the physical condition of their babies and treatment. When possible she gives talks to mothers' clubs."

"The nurse also visits children in the school and in the home. The babies of two and five the little bones are not easily bent, the delicate structures are often subjected to a diet unsuitable only for adults, failure to care for the baby teeth causes decay, often resulting in poor second teeth. Children at these ages are more exposed and more susceptible to what are called 'Children's diseases'."

"In school work the nurse assists the school teacher in medical inspection and examinations of the school children. She carries home advice to the parents of a child that is not perfectly well and explains the trouble and how it may be remedied. She holds a monthly inspection of the children to discover conditions interfering with mental health. Special attention is paid to the undernourished and underweight children. Their mothers are helped to plan correct diets for them and the children are taught to work for good health at home and at school."

"The tuberculosis nurse requires the nurse to visit the patients in their homes, showing the family how to carry out the doctor's orders for the recovery of the rest of the family. She nurses patients for those who are confined to bed and makes arrangements for hospital or sanatorium treatment if that is necessary. Those who come in daily contact and thus exposed to the disease are kept under observation."

"As a District or Visiting nurse the first duty is to give bedside care to patients in their homes and to instruct the family how to give the care between her visits. The teaching of health habits and demonstration of good health rules may be observed as an important part of this nursing care given in a home visit."

"The community nurse is a graduate of an accredited hospital training school and is a registered nurse. She must be registered in the state and also in the county. She is a public health nurse. To perform in the field of this work is to help her to meet the family and community problems which constitute a large part of her daily responsibility."

Hand Grenades At Savings Banks

Thirty thousand school children—probably more—will receive at the reopening of school in the fall a souvenir of the war. The number will be largely given. The number of the souvenir is a small amount of money in a savings bank. These banks are being manufactured from grenades designed for use by the American troops in the war.

When the armistice was signed the grenades were taken out of the hands of the soldiers and were transformed into "War Savings Banks" for an option on an additional 30,000. Under a law passed by the War Department for the distribution of the souvenirs, each child in the ten years old, who during the summer vacation came enough money to buy one War Savings Bank and submit to the teacher's account of how the money was earned, would be entitled to receive one of these. Children more than ten years would be required to purchase five War Savings banks.

The banks will be distributed in the fall by the teachers upon receipt of the pupils' entry. It will be for the teacher to determine whether the "savings bank" represent non-profit earnings.
