COST OF CARELESSNESS.

Carelessness and negligence are closely allied because they begin the same way and often end the same way, as is expressed in the sentiment: "Everyone for himself and the devil take the hindmost," and "I am not my brother's keeper."

The first of these two statements requires a stupendous sacrifice of life, limb and property as well as an inexcusable amount of self-sacrifice, and the second is equally true.

In the United States, in one year, there have been lost 50,000 lives, having incurred 2,000,000 injuries, and the cost of these losses amounts to over \$200,000,000. Most of this loss of life and limb and property was avoidable. It could be avoided if we would be more careful to insure all other men to safeguard life and property along similar lines. Instead of letting the devil take the hindmost, we can be our brother's keeper and co-accuse him that he endangers either his own life or that of his fellow man by his carelessness. We can do this by having the Department of Justice to try the individuals who have broken the law.

Another statement made in congress was that they did not wish to pay the expense attendant upon our dancing in our school buildings.
