## NEWS OF ILLINOIS

Jerseyville.—The Supreme court of the state of Illinois recently rendered a decision in a case brought before it by John B. Beatty of Jerseyville, who is to be the only survivor of the 100,000 men in Illinois. A similar decision was rendered in the case of Mr. James J. Walker, of New York, who in 1870 ran for President of the United States. In Mr. Beatty's case, the court held that he had nothing to do with his estate, which was valued at \$90,000, and he set free \$2,000 to his wife. The court also decreed that they file a bill, however, engaged by various heirs of Beatty to collect the estate. The Illinois Supreme Court ruled that the will will be disregarded as it is not in accordance with the ambiguity of the same, and also because the testator could not be sure of his property for 21 years when he made the rule against perpetuities.

Springfield.—Governor Frank Sennett announced the establishment of the senate committee to cooperate in the Chicago campaign to keep Illinois in the Union by presenting to congress Illinois' claim for the admission of the state to the Union of 10,000 cubic feet of water per second from Lake Michigan into the Illinois River. The committee consists of state members of the committee of ten: Frank O. Hansen, Bismarck; Frank J. Murphy, Chicago; Frank B. Hill, and Daniel Hersey, Chicago. The members of the committee are selected from the house of representatives, while Governor Sennett is authorized to apportion the other three members.

Chicago.—The Illinois Agricultural association and 46 other state agricultural bureaus will meet in Chicago on July 24, 25 and 26th of this month. The annual meeting of the American Farm Bureau Federation, the national organization to which all the state agricultural associations and state departments of agriculture of national agricultural policies are to be turned out at this year's meeting. The state agricultural bureaus are scheduled for an address.

Springfield.—Mrs. Katherine Harmon's plea in court that she be permitted to keep her four-month-old son until he is 18 months old was denied by the court. She could not get her son to the other side. Her son has made a move to aid Mrs. Harmon since her alleged confession of the crime. The trial will probably be October.

Springfield.—Illinois will conduct the state's first state-wide conference in connection with the state fair, to be held August 20-21, under the direction of the state's health and public health. Bribes between the ages of 10 and 18 will be examined and in the contest between the ages of six months and 10 years, the state's health and specialists will examine the youngsters and also judge those three in the contest.

Springfield.—The state fair, giving Secretary of State Louis L. Egan a chance to show the state's progress to compete with other states in advertising its products and new ways with which the state can be of service. The state fair, the automobile, state of prohibition enforcement agent, state of agriculture, state of health, are believed to initiate the formation of the government eventually to merge.
