## TRAFFIC NEEDS DIFFER; NO ONE ROAD BEST

U. S. Bureau of Roads and Bridges Fights Federal Highways to Local Conditions

No effort has been made to encourage the building of a particular type of road in the Federal projects administered by the Bureau of Agriculture. The law requires that the roads be built to the best advantage, but has not been interpreted to mean that only the most expensive types of roads are to be built, the bureau says. It has been recommended that the heavy and expensive construction of roads be limited to the big cities and towns, and that the roads leading to the smaller towns and cities be built of the more economical materials.
