Diphtheria Prevention

In 1921 there were thirteen cases of diphtheria in the city of Barrington, N. Y., and thirteen fatalities therefrom. Becoming alarmed at the situation the district supervisor of the State department of health with the cooperation of the city health officer and his staff, decided upon an experiment in community control of the disease by making use of the Shick diphtheria treatment. The plan as conceived at that time, and subsequently carried through, and to date over 4,000 have received complete treatments, not including those having received inoculations through the family physician. Since March 5, 1924, there has not been a single death from diphtheria in the entire city.

Tangible results of this sort are the best indication of the value of immunization. Until vaccination was made common throughout the country smallpox took its annual heavy toll of human life. Gradually, however, the value of smallpox vaccine came to be accepted as a matter of fact, vaccinations were insisted upon in all public schools, and the death rate for this disease gradually decreased. Smallpox has now been eliminated from the earth by means of vaccination.

At first parents of many children at Auburn refused to permit the Shick treatment to be given. Now that success has followed the experiment, however, these same parents have come to realize that vaccination, as a community measure, can enable us to dispel fear over diphtheria, and they have voluntarily brought their children to the clinics. Vaccination and immunization are not matters to be feared, but are outstanding contributions to the well-being of mankind.

Automobile Fatalities

If we wish to discouraging about the misuse of the safety factor in the operation of motor vehicles you can read those statistics which show that the yearly increase in deaths and accidents is not in proportion with the increase in the number of cars. We can read those statistics which show that for every 100,000 cars in use in 1926 our motorists have been killing 23,000 people a year, that the number of injured for the period is over 3,000,000 and that the economic loss is estimated at four billions of dollars. Motorists are so easily swept up to distract and death like these. These losses read war losses.

The statistics of the American Road Builders' Association hold that ninety-five per cent of the deaths and injuries are due to carelessness, the last five per cent due to faulty mechanism or improperly maintained highways. The educational campaign which has kept the death list from mounting still has a long way to go. But it's not enough. We can't dispense with automobiles; we can teach a greater number of people not to kill or get killed. The work must start in the school, continue in the homes and receive attention in magazines and newspapers. The price we pay for carelessness is unbearable.
