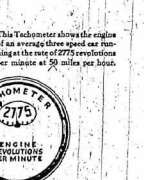
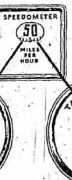

FOURTH OF JULY DEATHS

But I must confess that I never dreamed that it would come the stupendous electrical industry of today."

"Naturally I am gratified to feel that I have been privileged to play a part in this vast achievement. I am proud of the electrical industry of its vision, courage, and devotion to public service; and I suspect we all agree to feel the same way about it."

"It is a great reward to me and my colleagues and co-workers who, I believe, will say I will find that we have arrived to see the full fruit of our labors. The record is wonderful; but, fine as it is, it can be made still better, and I have a feeling that in your hands it will be."
