## C. & N. W. AGGRESS TO EXPAND 2 1/2 MILES OF TRACK

The Chicago and North Western Railroad Company has accepted an extension of the City of Elgin's franchise to build 2 1/2 miles of its tracks on the Wisconsin division from Paulina to Elgin. The franchise, which is valid for a period of ten years, will permit the railroad to expand its line to a point 100 feet above the level of the west drift tanks in Chicago, thus crossing the tracks of the Elgin and Western. ## THE PREMIER VISIT

Practically everywhere in the United States has observed with satisfaction the cordiality with which we received the recent visit of Prime Minister of England to President Hoover. And all hope that the result of their conferences may be a further important contribution to world peace.

In the present state of world affairs, however, it is just as wise to expect too much. There are many obstacles in the way of a disarmament program, and when every encouragement should be given to the efforts being made to overcome them, it is not wise to take too much for granted.

Much anxiety is felt concerning the outcome of the forthcoming peace conference next January, in which the United States, Great Britain and France and Japan are expected to participate. Whether the final agreements made between President Hoover and Premier MacDonald will lead to the promotion of the success of that conference remains to be seen. France and Italy appear to be apprehensive that the United States and England may be planning an alliance which would be disastrous to the world.

It is encouraging that peace parades are to be continued, and there is reason to hope that war may be made less probable in the future as a result. But it will require something more than disarmament conferences and peace parades, encouraging as they are, to insure a permanent peace.

## FARM LAND IN DEMAND

Improvement is noted in the demand for farm lands in many sections of the country, according to the presidents of several Federal land banks, who have been attending a conference.

One of the bankers stated that there is now more interest in farm lands than at any time during the past four or five years. He added that this is a good time to purchase a farm, as valuations are still relatively low, although some strengthening of prices is noted.

There seems to be a belief that agricultural prices will rise in the near future, and from now on will be steady and continuous. This improvement will be all the more certain if the farmers themselves will take advantage of the opportunities for cooperative marketing which are offered with the assistance of the new Federal Farm Board.

If the influences now at work for the betterment of agricultural conditions accomplish this much desired result, it will be of tremendous benefit, not only to the farmers, but to every branch of business and industry.

## STATISTICS TO ORDER

If one depends on the conflicting statistics put out as argument in favor of and against a measure, he will get more information of a satisfactory nature. While it is said that "figures can't lie," experience has proved that statistics not only can, but often do.

A case in point is seen in a statement by a church board which claims that the new law has increased the national debt by \$75 billion dollars, while the National Industrial Conference Board gives statistics which indicate that prohibition has caused a decrease of 175 billion dollars. One or both of these statements must be in error, perhaps both.

This recalls a story of the late publisher, E. W. Scripps, who decided to employ an expert to compile some statistics on the subject of national defense, making an offer of \$1000 for the job. The expert wired Mr. Scripps:

"Offer accepted. What do you want the statistics to show? Can deliver to suit."

## HE SAVED THE MAIL

More exciting than a movie thriller was a recent scene in Peoria River, Illinois, in which a small boy, Paul Rose Brunson, was the star, and a raging stream, a floating bridge, a pouch of mail and a boat, constituted the stage setting and accessories.

The boy was assisting in transferring

mail across the river over a temporary bridge which flood waters had rendered unsafe for vehicles. Suddenly a section of the bridge gave way and plunged into the river, carrying Paul and a pouch of mail with it. At the first dive the boy was carried entirely under the water, but after a few seconds, but within the section of bridge, now become a safe rock to the surface he came up with it, still clutching the precious mail.

Again and again he was swept under the swirling waters, but held on with one hand, keeping the mail bag in the other. For a time those on shore were powerless to help, but soon a boat came along and rescued him after the rambunctious bridge again. The weekly in a small town talks to its readers more intimately and confidentially than any other medium," Mr. O'Shaughnessy said.

It is a tribute from one of America's leading advertising authorities to the thousands of country publishers, many of whom are struggling under adverse conditions to faithfully serve their communities.

It should also impress town and small city merchants with the fact that the weekly newspaper offers the most effective medium for placing his store message before the people upon whom he must depend for his business existence.

## CITY OF WOMEN WORKERS

In the city of Chicago, there is a large segment of personnel regularly employed as in Washington, D. C. where the total reaches nearly 79,000, according to the census bureau. This is due principally to the great number represented by the numerous government departments.

The largest group among this army of female workers naturally includes government employees, other civil employees. The second largest class is composed of professional women, among whom are many doctors, lawyers, teachers and nurses, the total for this group being about 8,800. Other occupations absorbing large numbers of women are connected with manufacturing and trade activities. A considerable number of women are engaged in business of their own.

In Washington, as elsewhere, greatly increased opportunities for employment were offered women during the war and the conditions which arose at that time have continued to a large extent since.

## A GOOD IDEA

There is a wide-awake chamber of commerce in Mera, Ill., a city of around 10,000 inhabitants, which is making a determined effort to extend its trading area with good effect.

As a means toward the end sought, a series of 37 half-page advertisements, one to run each week, will be placed in the Paris-Beacon News, setting forth the advantages of the town as a trading center.

The chamber of commerce, after trying various methods for building good will, concluded that newspaper advertising is the most effective means of getting its message to the most people.

Other towns have adopted this plan to trade expansion with highly beneficial results, and many more might profit by their example.

## GIVING U.S. EXPORTS

In a review of United States exports and imports for the fiscal year ended June 30, the Department of Commerce shows that exports increased in value about 10 per cent, while imports increased about three and one-half per cent over the previous fiscal year.

Exports increased by approximately 10 per cent, so that the increase was accounted for chiefly by the greater exportation of manufactured goods.

In the matter of merchandise the United States exported more than a billion dollars in excess of imports.

In view of the higher wages paid by our manufacturers in comparison with foreign manufacturers, this shows a high tribute to American production methods and marketing.
