
Here Is My Position, Platform, and Promises:

RE-ELECT LYONS

Two years ago the voters of Cuba township helped to send Richard J. Lyons of Moundville to the General Assembly as one of the three Republican representatives from the eighth senatorial district. This was the first time in the history of the state that southwestern Lake county has ever been directly represented in the General Assembly.

Representative Lyons' record at Springfield was such as to justify the confidence placed in him by the voters. He tackled the job with great energy. He did not miss a roll call during the entire session of the fifty-sixth assembly. He studied all legislation that came before the House and voted "Yes" or "No" on every bill. He showed entire independence in voting and did not refuse to be recorded.

Representative Lyons exhibited fine qualities of leadership and his entire period of service indicated that he is a young man destined to go far in public life. He attracted the favorable attention of leaders in the Senate and House, and of the press, not only of his own district but of the state. He did not forget the friends who had helped him, neither did he play politics to satisfy them. He was always the interests of his friends to the detriment of the state at large. In short he was the embodiment of the spirit of true representation "of the people, by the people and for the people."

There are eight Republicans who seek nominations for representative from the eighth district at the April 8th primary. Only three can be nominated. Voters of the district will do well to return Mr. Lyons to Springfield; voters of Cuba township and southwestern Lake county will do well to help him all they can. His name is second on the ballot under the heading "For Representative in the General Assembly."

WALTER ECKERSALL

Followers of sports have suddenly recently by the sudden death of Walter H. Eckersall, one of the greatest football stars of all time, also famous sport writer and referee. His life was snuffed out by a heart attack at the age of 42.

Eckersall attained the pinnacle of gridiron fame and glory and quietness in the years of Chicago from 1900 and 1906, being chosen as a member of Walter Camp's mythical All-Americans in three successive years. During his football days Eckersall's weight ranged from only about 120 pounds to 160, and he was a lightning fast and agility that he moved down heavyweight rivals who crossed his path.

By the younger generation of sportswriters he was widely known and acclaimed as a football writer and referee of the highest rank. His contributions to the sporting page will be sadly missed by his admiring followers.

Eckersall's early death will again revive the argument as to whether too strenuous athletic competition is a factor in the decline of manhood in this later life. This is a good deal of evidence to indicate that this is so, but the ambitious college athletes will hardly modify his exertions on that account.

THE AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT TOLL GROWS

According to a bulletin issued by one of the largest auto clubs in the country, in the week we are in vain for a single congressional element is the automobile accident situation." One-third of all the accidental deaths among policyholders of this company, during the larger part of last year, were caused by the automobile. It is the only

form of accidental death now on the increase in this country.

During 1929, 31,500 people lost their lives in motor accidents. This was the largest casualty record in history, representing a 13 per cent increase over 1928. Motor vehicle registrations increased but eight per cent during the year.

To quote further from the insurance report, among the insured the automobile caused as many deaths as measles, scarlet fever, diphtheria, and pneumonia—the four principal childhood diseases. More than two per cent of deaths from all causes are automobile accidents.

We have been pitifully inadequate in dealing with the careless, irresponsible, drunken or otherwise negligent driver, who leaves death and destruction in his wake.

Every town and state should modernize its traffic laws and discipline those who disobey them. Such a nation-wide program would decrease the accident rate.

This automobile accident menace is every citizen's problem.

POWER AND PROGRESS

So accustomed are many people to think of New York City as ranking first in nearly everything that it may be surprising to many to be told that the cities of Chicago, Philadelphia, and Detroit, also use more electric current than the great metropolis.

New York uses only two-thirds as much current as Chicago, it nevertheless uses four times as much as London, and more than twice as much as either Paris or Berlin.

More than 4,000 towns and villages have added electricity in the past five years, an increase in communities served of 25 per cent. Americans will spend more than a billion dollars this year for household electrical equipment alone, exclusive of the tremendously bigger investments in the field of industry. Washers, ironing machines, vacuum cleaners, percolators, toasters and dozens of other home appliances will help to swell the demand, so that it is no wonder that each year as all the rest of the world, although our population is only one-twentieth of the total.

Which is added explanation of why America's progress remains the wonder of the rest of mankind.

FOR THOSE WHO LIKE FIGURES

If a nation's consumption of world products was strictly in proportion to its population, the United States would absorb only seven per cent of those products. If production were proportionate to area, we would supply only six per cent of the world's output. How tremendously we deviate from such procedure is illustrated by some bare figures.

Uncle Sam, representing 7 per cent of the world's population, consumes 42 per cent of the world's products. He uses 20 per cent of the crude petroleum, 55 per cent of the crude rubber, 26 per cent of the coal, 83 per cent of the tin, 48 per cent of the coffee, 21 per cent of the sugar, 72 per cent of the silk and upward of 80 per cent of the automobiles.

He supplies the gigantic mass of universal demand with 39 per cent of its coal, 35 per cent of its hydroelectric power, practically all of its natural gas, 71 per cent of its oil, 60 per cent of its wheat and cotton, 55 per cent of its timber, 38 per cent of its lead and phosphates, and 90 per cent or more of its copper, iron and steel.

WHAT'S THE MATTER WITH THE AMERICAN FARMER

Why does the American farmer produce more per year with less labor and on fewer acres? The answer is to be found in the Department of Agriculture.

He knows more about his soils and plants and animals.

He is in a better position to combat pests. He knows how to apply his labor more efficiently.

He is using more fertilizer. He is feeding his livestock better.

He selects and plants better seed, breeds and feeds better animals.

He is, in fact, a more efficient peasant and the year before, and he seems likely to be more efficient every year from now on. Why? Because that's just the kind of farmers this country has.
