

**Miles T. Lamey,  
Editor of Review,  
Dies From Fall**

Miles T. Lamey, editor and publisher of the Barrington Review and owner and manager of Lamey & Company, retail paint store, met death accidentally December 5 from a fall down a private staircase leading to his apartment on the second floor of his store and office building at 100-102 North Cook street. **Parents Early Settlers**

Miss Thomas Lamey was the son of the late Edward and Julia Lamey, who settled in Barrington in 1855.

and the family name is closely linked with that of the early history of Barrington. Edward Lamey purchased land in Cuba township, now in the village limits, from Willard Stevens who secured it from the government. He erected a residence which was one story and a half high, the first building in the vicinity higher than one story, and considered by some unsafe because of the winds sweeping over the timberless prairies. He was an ardent lover of trees and set out

many of the beautiful trees now gracing the north side. In 1873 he purchased a church building from the Methodist denomination and presented it to the Chicago diocese for use as a Catholic church, although two other churches subsequently shared in the purchase. This is the present St. Anne's church. His business was that of a contractor and mason and was the forerunner of the present business of Lamey & Company.

Miles T. Lamey was active many years of his life in local government and civic affairs. He was born November 11, 1868, and was cashier of a local bank before he had attained his majority. He was clerk of the Town of Cuba from 1892 to 1896 and village clerk from 1893 to 1901. He was mayor of Harrington from 1902 to 1907 and was re-elected in 1908 and serving until 1914. He was elected Supervisor of the Town of Cuba in 1896 and was re-elected continuously until 1910, when he ceased to be a candidate. In 1900-1901 he was

Mr. Lamey had been a member of the board of directors of the First State Bank of Barrington since 1910, when he ceased to be a candidate. In 1900-1901 he was chairman of the Lake county Board of Supervisors. He established the Barrington Review in 1885, and had been its editor and publisher since that time.

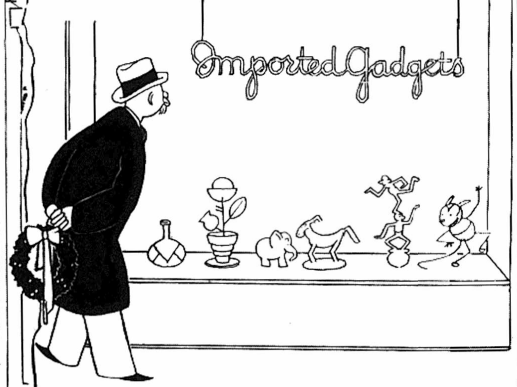

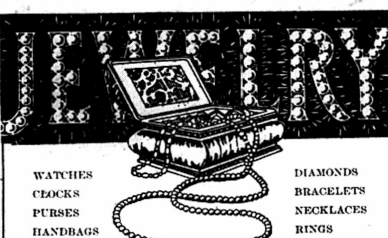
