J. E. Bistor, president of the Association of Real Estate Tax Payers of Illimois in a stiff protest letter to J. L. The statement summarizes "At this time nearly a quarter of a million homes of Cook county citizens are subject to sale or forfeiture to the state for delinquent taxes. Real estate must be given relief—substantial adequate relief."

Now very few persons in Cook county will disagree with the statement that real estate must be given relief. That is a fact without chance of logical contradiction. But the method of relief is a subject for honest debate. The Association of Real Estate Tax Payers has really accumulated enough facts about the personal property situation to disprove the thing it is attempting to prove, that real estate can find relief in personal property assessment alone.

There is a substitute for the real estate tax and a good one, but it is not the personal property tax. To be good, a tax must not only be fair but must be practical.
