Paddock Bills in Legislature Would Modify Pauper Act

A plan to temper the Pian Pauper act is embodied in two bills presented in the state senate by Ray Paddock, of Elmhurst, and a bill for all counties under 200,000 population to furnish relief to war veterans and their families, and the second that the county should support all persons admitted to the paupers' home which is maintained by the county.

The Paddock plan would relieve the townships from the necessity for providing relief to all paupers, as relief under the Bogardus act for war veterans, and would also relieve the township from paying a set rate for relief. The bill, if passed, would sent the county poor farm to the county hospital for treatment.

Under the Pian act in many cases the relief work overlaps from townships to counties, and the Paddock bill is not supposed to be furnishing poor relief.

However, the Pian act eliminates the inequitable distribution of poor-funds. In Lake county, for example, all property used to pay equally in taxes for poor relief. Waukegan derived most of the benefit.

Central Lake County

Community Club Asks Organization Charter

A central Lake county clearing house for jobs will be one of the first undertakings of the new organization of business men of the central part of the county to be known as the Lake Regions Civic Association.

The clearing house is planned to implement the work of the township superintendents. Persons having any odd jobs to do will notify the clearing house masters. Men wanting a job will be given the jobs, thus assiting the persons having employment to offer and those not needing employment. At the same time, the entrepreneur will learn how many of the needy are willing to work for assistance.

A chamber of commerce will be formed by Edward J. H. Hargan, secretary of state, if a request of several Round Lake and Grays Lake business men is approved.

Marketing organization will take into roads and transportation in the central part of the country, launch a trade at home campaign, and invite visitors in the surrounding towns as summer guests with the hope of making them permanent residents.
