In Relation to the **Development of Your** Community

The Office of

### **Road Commissioner**

Is Important to Both Village and Township

The election of an efficient, honest, commissioner who has full time to devote to repair and maintenance of roads in Barrington township is of more than passing importance to the township and to the village. Barrington has developed as a home community of the first order. It can develop much more. Country gravel roads comprise one of the first assets of the community to be seen by prospective rural home owners and renters. Consequently the roads are silent salesmen of real estate in the community.
