FACTS for Fair-Minded **Cuba Voters**

The Lake county budget was cut \$200,000 this fiscal year.

The assessed valuation of all real estate in Cuba township and Lake county was reduced 15 per cent. Despite this reduction the county tax rate cut 9 cents.

The Cuba town tax rate is the lowest in Lake county.

These cuts and economies will be reflected in the tax bill that you will receive in a few days. Not all taxing bodies have cut their rates. Some are actually higher. But Cuba township and Lake county is doing its part for lower taxes.

Your supervisor worked earnestly for these cuts and economies.

When responsibility for care of the poor was thrown onto the townships over a year ago. I organized a campaign to raise funds for the purpose. We saved the taxpayers money, but were able to take care of every needy family.

When the Barrington Relief Committee was ecently obligated to discontinue its activities, ubat township was in a position to take over its ook on the Lake county side.

I have obtained \$3000 of the motor fuel tax fund for relief in Cuba—a third more than was alloted to us.

\$290 worth of milk has been distributed this winter, at no cost to the taxpayer. The farmer received full price.

What public officer has carried out his obligations more humanely or efficiently?

When the First State Bank of Barrington closed its does over a year ago, all of the public funds for which I am responsible were in that bank—Town, Road and Bridge, and Poor Punds. All of these moneys have been returned to their proper uses. Neither the taxpayer nor my bondsmen have lost a cent.

When I was elected supervisor the town fund was over \$1500 in debt. I paid off this debt, the township on a cash basis, and reduced the tax rate in three years' time. When the Town Board audited my books last Tuesday they found a cash balance on hand of \$1645.03—at the tag end of a year that has made heavy demands on public funds.

I have brought over \$1000 in county business to the merchants of Barrington the past year— business that formerly went exclusively to the county seat.

county seat.

I fought for the retention of a county veterinarian, and Lake county has recently been declared an accredited county—the only accredited county in northern Illinois.

county in northern Illinois.

I was successful in giving Barrington a state motorcycle police office—the first it had. I succeeded in placing a Barrington man in the sheriff soffice. I was one of the organizers of the county radio police system. Call to the sheriff's office in time of trouble will be relayed to a sheriff's office ruising squad car by radio within two minutes. Help will reach you quickly.

I reduced my own sealers.

I reduced my own salary approximately 30 per cent. I have given every minute of time to my job as supervisor that the public welfare demanded. I have held and now hold important committee assignments.

I am not surprised at being attacked and maligned. That is the only ammunition of the opposition. All that I ask of the fair-minded voters of Cuba township ask that they come to me with any reports about which they are uneasy. Give me an opportunity to answer my accuserator submit my evidence. I am on trial; I should be given that right. My accounts and records are open to your inspection. I have never resorted to secrecy or star chamber sessions.
