Dr. Herman N. Bundesen, president of the board of health, recently called attention to the insidious dangers resulting from the breathing of carbon monoxide. The warning said:

"Every year there is a needless loss of life due to carbon monoxide poisoning, which is caused by inhaling the automobile exhaust gas containing this dangerous substance. The breathing of this deady gas is, undoubtedly, responsible for some accidents on the highways.
"At this time of the year, with the approach of cool and cold weather, motorists should be warned against running motors for any length of turn in small private garages unless the windows and doors are open, and not at all when the doors are closed."
