Auto Struck in Mt. Prospect on Way to Game at Bensenville

Six Barrington high school football players were hurt in an automobile accident in Mt. Prospect Monday afternoon when an automobile crashed into the side of the car in which they were riding. The players who were

on their way to take part in a football game at Bensenville were Herbert Mollenkamp, Tom Pettis owner of the car, Wilfred Wiehman, Ted Kampert, Norris Grabenkort and Jerry Kampert.

The impact forced the car to the side of the road, turned it half way over and then back to an upright position. Three of the boys were riding in the turtle of the coupe and were thrown clear the car.

Mollenkamp, who was driving, was the most seriously injured. Three ribs on his left side were broken by the door of the car which was crushed against his side and his hip was injured as he was thrown on the high way. Pettie sustained a severe gash

es to close, and Wichman was knocked unconscious by the collision. None of the three boys who were thrown from the back of the car were injured. Kampert who tumbled head first to the pavement, but the fact that he was wearing his football helmet saved him from severe injuries.
