Brazil First Discovered  
in Year 1500 by Pinzon

Following the discovery by Columbus of what was thought to be a part of India, the Spanish navigators applied to Pope Alexander VI, who was recognized as the arbiter of international disputes, for a decree which would divide them to share in any lands discovered in the westward search for India. Prior to the time of Columbus, westward exploration had been almost entirely under the auspices of the king of Portugal.

Alexander VI issued a decree in which all the undiscovered regions of the world were divided between Spain and Portugal at a line fixed by the Treaty of Tordesillas in 1494 at 370 leagues west of the Cape Verde Islands, and Spain was given full power to colonize discoveries west of this line while Portugal was limited to lands east of the line.

Contrary to all expectations, Portugal was very speedily deprived of any part of America, as all of the western hemispheres except a part of the coast of Brazil lay beyond the "line of demarcation."

What later became Brazil was first discovered in 1500 by Vicente Yanez Pinzon, a companion of Columbus on an early voyage, and was reached in 1501 by Pedro Alvarez Cabral. The latter discovered the coast on Good Friday and took over the region in the name of the king of Portugal on Easter Sunday.

Bunyan Wrote Pilgrim's Progress While Prisoner

The son of a Bedford tinker wrote this famous book while in prison for non-payment of his taxes in the days of the Cavaliers and the Roundheads (King Charles' followers and Cromwell), and it was for the latter that Bunyan fought in the wars, because, after a day and rather wild youth, he had become a strict Puritan, and he had added to become a preacher, and as

he was not careful enough to get a license, first to permit him to do his preaching, he was thrown into prison—and there he began work on a book. When at last he was brought to the Pilgrim's Progress" out of prison—the tale of a brave and faithful Christian who had a life full of the most thrilling adventures. Bunyan modeled his writing on the lovely, simple prose of the Authorized Version of the Bible, for he knew that book so well and appreciated its literary style; the struggles of his hero Christian are vividly and clearly described, and even the allegory of the ultimate triumph of Right after terrible hardship and difficulties is understandable to children, who enjoy this classic story as much as the grownups do.—*Montreal Herald.*

**Social Titles**  
The titles of Mr. Mrs. and Miss are several centuries old. In books of the sixteenth century, "Mr." was read as "Master" and "Mrs." as "Mistress." The title Miss is merely the diminutive of "mistress," and formerly any woman or girl was addressed as "Mrs." whether married or not. According to Edward "Words, Facts and Phrases" at a time when men were generally called by their Christian and surname only, the word "Mistress" was probably applied as a sort of title to those who had learned a mystery of trade, and who would be looked upon as of higher rank or position than mere laborers or husbandmen.

**Scottish Terriers**  
In its native Scotland, the Scottish terrier has been known for over a century but for more than half this period was without an accepted name. After years of bitter dispute between fanes of Scottish and northern England he was finally labeled with the proud title of Scottish Terrier supplanting such names as Aberdeen, Highland, Cairn and Scotch. The only survival of these misnomers is Aberdeen.

**Where Coral Is Found**  
Coral is found widespread on the borders and around islands of the Mediterranean sea. DEPOSIT MEASUREMENTS  
Deposits in First National Bank to Be Insured Jan. 1

1700 Local Accounts Receive Benefit of Federal Deposit Corporation

Approximately \$300,000 deposited in the First National Bank of Barrington, Ill. accounts and current cash requirements of 1700 deposit accounts, will be insured 100 per cent by the Federal Deposit Corporation through the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

The First National Bank, which is a member of the federal reserve system, automatically comes under the deposit insurance act. According to the plan of the act, all deposits will be insured for one year up to \$2500 during the period from January 1, to July 31, 1934. After July 1, all deposits will be insured 100 per cent up to \$10,000. Deposits in excess of \$10,000 will be insured 90 per cent up to the \$10,000 mark and 50 per cent above \$10,000.

The bank has been assured that 100 per cent of its deposits which are insured. They will be insured for one year or more, depending on the nature of the deposit. If a total of \$2500 or more is deposited in the bank, the insured amount will be \$10,000. If the insured amount is less than \$2500, the insured amount will be the amount of the deposit.
