To the People of Barrington

We regret very much that we were unable to furnish you your usual milk delivery service during the recent milk strike. This service was interfered with through no fault of ours or of our producers, nor did we er our producers take any part in or support the strike.

We believe that our farmers have been very regularly paid a better price for their milk than most farmers selling to Chicago dairies. For last month's milk we are paying \$1.94 per cwt. for all milk delivered to our plant and this we believe is at least 15 per cent better than the average price paid. Our farmers have had no surplus since last May.

We are telling you this to show that we are trying to be fair with our farmers and in return we enjoy their support and good will.

We wish to thank our customers for the cheerfulness with which they accepted the interruption of their milk delivery.

We thank our producers for their splendid showing of loyalty to us and to the people of Barrington.

We compliment the Barrington police department for the prompt protection they gave us and for their helpful advice which prevented any violence at our plant.

It is very gratifying to know that the village board came to our support in our efforts to give Barringtoon an uninterrupted milk supply. We shall try to conduct our business in such ways as to always enjoy such

A story has been passed about which we brand as absolutely false

This story is to the effect that we promised a representative of the striking farmers that we would not send any milk to a certain out-of-town customer and then failed to keep our word. No such promise

We expressed a willingness however to make the promise if in return we could be allowed to serve our Barrington customers. A director of the Pure Milk Association refused to allow any delivery whatsoever
