He founded the Austin State bank in 1895 and in 1910 Founded the Standard Trust and State bank in 1895 and in 1910 founded the Standard Trust and Savings bank. He often related how he had obtained the charter, hired officers and clerks, and set up a complete organization at a cost of \$400.

He was president of Standard until its consolidation with the

National Bank of the Republic in
