Speaking before the American Gas association at its re-Speaking before the American Gas association at its re-cent conjention in Atlantic City, managing director Alex-ander Forward and H. O. Caster, president of the association, courageously criticised the revolutionary program of the Tennessee valley autisority and the Electric farm and home authority as examples of a federal attempt to cripple public

utilities with funds raised from the utilities own taxes.

M.r Forward charged that "public revenues are being used to foster competition and to sell domestic services in used to ascier competition and to sen commence services in no way superior, and in most cases inferior and more expen-sive. Governmental agencies with unlimited machinery for propagands are employed. Those in charge of the experiprogram all over the United States.

"Under threat of direct government competition, the TVA and EFHA have forced reductions of electric rates; have by fear forced the manufacturers of electric appliance luce prices and bring out new models and have spon-deferred payment plans for the sale of appliances

sored deterred payment plans for the sale of appliances which it is difficult for any competition to meet."

Mr. Caster asserted that "state regulation may not be perfect, but it is better than any federal regulation can be," and that "if privately owned and operated utilities are destroyed, progress in the industry will cease."

He pointed out that the program also includes machin-for loaning public money, "of which 30 per cent is a ation, to any municipality to construct a utility plant. Many such loans have been approved by cities already quately served by private plants, and in such cases cause an unwarranted destruction of private investments.

The private utility also carries a heavy tax burden ke the municipal plants."
